AGOH Impact

- More than 2 million people in rural Ethiopia have been helped with an average cost of \$9 per person.
- To date, AGOH has built more than 210 health centers, 6,700 water wells and 520 school buildings, and distributed over 19,000 micro-finance loans in rural Ethiopia.

A Glimmer of Hope (AGOH) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization founded in 2000 and based in Austin, Texas, USA.

AGOH's model focuses on four areas of development: water, health, education, and microfinance. The experience and the knowledge gained from indigenous Ethiopian development organizations has shown that the integration of these four sectors provides those living in extreme poverty with the best chance of improving their lives.

AGOH's own endowment pays for all overhead costs, allowing 100% of funds donated to go directly to the projects in Ethiopia.

Health Facts Ethiopia

- Ethiopia has one of the highest child mortality rates in the world. (*CIA World Factbook, 2013*)
- 106 of every 1000 children die before the age of 5. (*UNICEF, 2010*)

My husband and I first visited Ethiopia in 2008, and after witnessing the life-changing work of A Glimmer of Hope, we started our own fundraising campaign which we call "Water is Life".

100% of the money we raise is given to AGOH to fund water wells in rural Ethiopia. As of May 2013 we have funded over 15 wells and raised more than \$80,000.

During a donor trip to Ethiopia with AGOH in June, 2012 we visited the Tercha Hospital. It serves nearly 1 million people, but has no separate pediatric ward to give proper care to its youngest and weakest patients.

Health Fact Ethiopia

- 18% of deaths under the age of five in Ethiopia can be attributed to respiratory infections. (UNICEF, 2012)

“Visiting the room with sick and malnourished children absolutely broke my heart. A four-year old boy was so weak that his grandmother had to hold him up to sit. It’s an image that will never leave me.”

I was even more shocked when I realized that the wall separating his room from the next, only reached a meter-and-a-half off the floor. Two rooms down we had just passed a woman with TB struggle with a seemingly endless cough. TB is a life-threatening airborne disease and there was nothing stopping the air flow between the rooms.”
